They sacrifice the little pleasures of living with their family, joys of watching their kids' grow and flourish, caring for their elder parents, the small family picnics and what not to bravely and selflessly guard borders. They have our surrendered their lives for our nation. They live with the fact that they may face death at any moment in their lives. These heroes are honoured and remembered every year by our society on specific days commemorating them and their unfathomable services, depicting their struggle and state honours.

INDIAN NAUY DAY

The theme of Indian Navy Day 2022 is "Swarnim Vijay Varsh". Navy Week is observed from 1 to 7 December. The purpose Day celebrate Navy acknowledge and appreciate the Indian Navy's achievements and increase awareness about the Navy amongst Indian Citizens. The objective of the celebration is to commemorate the actions of the Indian Navy's 'Operation Trident' at Karachi harbour as it was decisive in securing India's victory in the 1971 war. It was decided that Navy Day would be celebrated on 4 December at the Senior Naval Officer's Conference in May 1972. On this day, The Indian Navy demonstrated India's combat prowess and through capability an 'Operational Demonstration' at Visakhapatnam on December 4, 2022. General Anil Chauhan, Chief of Defense Staff, Admiral R Hari Kumar Chief of Naval Staff, Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari Chief of Air Staff & Lt Gen BS Raju, Vice Chief of Air Staff paid homage to the brave hearts at the National War Memorial on the occasion of Navy Day.



Under Swarnim Vijay Varsh 2022, it is very important for you to realize that the credit for the establishment of the Navy goes to the East India Company. The foundation of the Indian Navy was laid in the form of the Indian Marine in 1612 by the East India Company itself. Before independence, the Indian Navy was known as the Royal Indian Navy, but later its name was changed to Indian Navy. The Indian Navy was established 408 years ago on 5 September, 1612 under Swarnim Vijay Varsh 2022. Maratha emperor Chhatrapati Shivaji Bhosale is called the father of the Indian Indian Ναυμ. Navy under Swarnim Vijay Varsh 2022 is headquartered in Delhi and it has 3 Commands which are Western Naval Command, Eastern Naval Command and Southern Naval Command.

ARMED FORCES FLAG DAY

India annually observes Armed Forces Flag Day on December 7. The main objective of the Armed Forces Flag Day is to collect funds from people for the betterment of the Armed Forces staff just by selling batches, stickers, and other items. On 28th August 1949, the Ministry of Defence decided to celebrate this day, to honour the soldiers, sailors, and airmen. This day intends to tribute the valiant and martyred soldiers and to revamp the harmony of citizens. The annual celebration is focused to provide rehabilitation to the war victims.

UIJAY DIWAS



India annually observes Vijay Diwas on December 16. The historic military triumph over Pakistan in the 1971 War is commemorated on this day. The Indo-Pakistani War of 1971 was a military conflict between India and Pakistan that took place in East Pakistan from 3 December 1971 until Pakistan's surrender in Dhaka on 16 December 1971. Bangladesh Liberation War, the conflict erupted after Pakistan

launched 'Operation Chengiz Khan', a preemptive aerial attack on 11 Indian air stations. This action sparked hostilities with Pakistan and India's support for Bengali nationalist forces in East Pakistan's war for independence, escalating the already-existing conflict with Indian and Pakistani forces fighting on both the eastern and western fronts. The Pakistani military's Eastern Command signed of surrender instrument on December 16, 1971, in Dhaka, thirteen days after the war began giving India a definite advantage. This signaled the creation of East Pakistan as the new country of Bangladesh.

Every year 15 January is observed as Indian Army Day because on this day in 1949 field Marshal Kodandera Madappa Cariappa took over as the first Commander-in-Chief of the Indian Army from General Sir Francis Butcher, the last British Commander-in-Chief.



MARTYRS' DAY OR SHAHEED DIWAS



30 January is celebrated as Martyr's Day or Shaheed Diwas every year in memory of Mahatma Gandhi and the sacrifice of three revolutionaries of India. As, of 30 January 1948, the 'Father of Nation' was assassinated.

PULWAMA ATTACK

On February 14th 2019, at least 40 CRPF jawans lost their lives after a suicide bomber drove a car laden with explosives into the security force convoy. The attack was carried out by Pakistani terror group Jaish-e-Mohammed, which is led by Masood Azhar based in Bahawalpur. 4 years of Pulwama attack: PM Modi remembers martyrs, says 'will never forget their supreme sacrifice' Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday paid tributes to the 40 Central Reserve Police Force personnel who lost their lives in the Pulwama



terror attack four years ago. "Remembering our valorous heroes who we lost on this day in Pulwama. We will never forget their supreme sacrifice. Their courage motivates us to build a strong and developed India", the prime minister tweeted.

My brother left me as enemy, And my friend played a frenemy,





UNKNOWN FREEDOM FIGHTERS


KAMALA DEVI CHATTOPADHYAY

Kamala Devi Chattopadhyay was driving force behind renaissance of Indian handicrafts, handlooms and theatre in post-independence India. In Seva Dal, she was in charge of the women's wing and recruited, trained and organized the Sevikas. She contested elections for Madras Provincial Legislative Assembly, thus becoming the first woman to contest election for a legislative seat. She



established Indian Cooperative Union to help with the rehabilitation. She established a series of "crafts museums" to preserve and protect India's arts and crafts; and also instituted the National Awards for Master Craftsmen; Central Cottage Industries Emporia throughout India. For drama, she started Natya Institute of Kathak and Choreography (NIKC), Bangalore in 1960s.

BIRSA MUNDA



Birsa Munda belongs to the Munda tribal community, and he was a folk rebellion, tribal freedom fighter, and religious leader. Birsa started a movement called 'Ulgulan', or 'The Great Tumult'. During that time, people call him "Dharti Abba", which means "Father of the Earth". He gathered a large religious movement against the British missionaries and their

conversion activities. He revolted against the Christian missionary's religious conversion activities mainly with the help of the Munda and Oraon Tribal Community people.

MANGAL PANDEY

On March 29, 1857, Pandey attempted to incite his fellow sepoys to rise up against the British. He attacked two of those officers and when he was restrained, he attempted to shoot himself. However, he was eventually overpowered and arrested. Mangal Pandey ignited the spark that finally won India its independence 90 years later. Mangal Pandey's mutiny intensified the feeling of frustration and anger felt by the Indian sepoys against the British. Mangal Pandey, the rising freedom fighter, became one of the first rebels before the beginning of the revolt of 1857.





FACTS ABOUT INDIAN FLAG

- The first Indian flag was hoisted on August 7, 1906 at Parsi Bagan Square in Calcutta.
- The Indian National Flag was designed by Pingali Venkayya, an educationist and freedom fighter from Andhra Pradesh.
- The Chakra denotes the continual progress of the country. Its blue colour connotes the boundless sky and fathomless sea.
- On 15 January 2022, on the occasion of the Army Day, the Indian Army unveiled the world's largest Tiranga, as the Indian National Tricolour Flag is popularly called, at Jaisalmer. It was made of khadi and measured 33,750 sq. ft.!!


BOOK RECOMMENDATIONS





ECONOMIC GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT

Economic Growth can be defined as an increase in the value of goods and services produced in an economy over a period of time. The value calculation is done in terms of percentage (%) increase in Gross Domestic Product (GDP). Economic growth is calculated in terms where the effects of variation that has been found in the value of goods and services due to inflation distortion are also being accounted for. Economic growth increased state capacity and the supply of public goods. We can state an essential point that when economies thoroughly increases its growth, we can observe the integration of the services that would be ready and available to the public with the help of taxes and the revenues which were received would be helpful to the public needs and can be utilized to provide the services to the citizens such as healthcare, education, basic services like sanitation and vaccinations camps and other social protections in our society. GDP (Gross Domestic Product) is one the most essential indicator in our Indian economy where it is used by economists all over the world in order to determine the growth of the economy. It takes total production of the country in a year into the account in order to know the contribution of the GDP of a country towards the economic growth. Growth increases when GDP reaches its maximum and vise versa. Many Economists, Entrepreneurs always wanted GDP to be on top and GDP's maximization would be accomplished when citizens spend more towards the produced products, when more jobs were created and when tax is received in enough numbers and workers gets enough wages for the services rendered. Now GDP can be calculated in three ways: using the production, expenditure and income approach. GDP can be calculated as GDP= C+I+G+NX in India where C is the consumption expenditure, G is government expenditure, I is the investment and G is Government expenditure, and NX is Net Exports. The main characteristic of economic growth is the increase in capital goods, labour force, technology and human capital can all contribute towards the economic growth. There are four phases of economic growth like expansion, peak, contraction and trough. Economic growth can be generated and dependent on few contributory areas of our economy such as rapid increase in physical capital goods, adequate growth in

labour force and the advance technology that is been introduced efficiently. Under the flagship of higher physical capital goods, we can assert the simple example to have deep understanding is, a fisherman with a net will catch more fish per hour than fisherman with a pointy stick despite both the things seems critical in the procedure. Sometimes in the economy must go ahead with engagement in some form of saving (sacrificing their current consumption) in order to free up the resources to create the new capital. Similarly the latest and advanced technology will also certainly helpful for the workers to complete their works efficiently and elsewhere the growth of labour force would also result higher even with the higher generation of goods and services respectively. The main purpose of economic growth is to measure the increase of people's real income- means that the ratio between people's income and the prices of what they can purchase is increasing goods and services which would become more beneficial and affordable to the citizens where the minimum purchasing power would be in place where it can result in people becoming down to earth and poor. Thus, on a whole economic growth can be achieved with the help of Economic Development. Yes, Economic Development is the main indicator to achieve the economic growth. There is a correlation between economic growth and development where growth happens through the changes that are being bought under the flagship of development in the economy. The term Economic Development can be explained as the process by which economic well-being and quality of a nation, community or particular region are upgraded and improved according to the predefined goals and objectives. It is the combination of market productivity and the welfare of the nation. Now, it is important to state that the growth happens only when the development of a region takes place. Economic development is the programs, policies, legislations, activities and various flagships launch which focusses on forging the economy that will improve the economic wellbeing and quality of life for a community. Our development of life and the standard of living is absolutely based on the community we live in as each community has its own opportunities, challenges and priorities. With the introduction of various programs, our economy will

standardize and foster ahead with good numbers and thereby result us in development. Eradication of Poverty, Minimizing unemployment by creating employment opportunities, Introducing startups, launching skill development programs, maintaining health administration well by using latest technology under life and health sciences, Standardized Education system and the policies, upgrading the municipal departments and urban development sectors, establishing Special Economic Zones, Regulating and increasing the Power supply, maintenance of district administration with enough facilities and awareness camps and programs etc are few developmental goals required to achieve the economic development and maintain a well balanced region respectively. We can also assert that economic development is also much concentrated on tax base enhancements, job retention and quality of life too. Economic development is a critical and essential component that drives the economic growth in an economy, with relevant developmental goals, that includes increased access towards the opportunities created by economic growth for existing and future residents. There are even developed region economists who firmly believe and agree that the key stages of development are related to three different transitions: A) \boldsymbol{A} Structural transformation of the economy B) A Demographic transition and C) A Process of Urbanization. The progress of economic changes in India is followed closely where the World Banks and Financial Institutions suggest that the most important priorities are public sector reform, infrastructure, agriculture and rural development etc would lead towards balanced developmental environment. Countries like India might go well by reducing its import dependence and establishing domestic capacity, which calls for a substantial increase in public sector investments. Now, it is recorded that India's current economy is accounted with 7.2% of global economy in 2022 in PPP terms, and around 3.4% in nominal terms in the year 2022. As India is rich in agricultural reforms and sectors, the introduction of various technologies and also accomplishment of objective and developments would lead to greater increase in the economic growth flagship especially to the underdeveloped regions. In order to achieve the balanced region development, all the key goals are needed to be achieved. It is unfortunate that India stood at 132nd position in Human Development Index (HDI) and China despite underdeveloped country were stood at 79th position in HDI. HDI is the one



of the most essential indicator for economic development. The strategies that can be used in the goal of increasing the human development index are improving public services and access to health and infrastructure, improving clean drinking water pump pipes and ensure clean drinking water, sanitizing the infected areas, conducting the medical camps and vaccination drives at the rural areas primarily etc. The factors which are used to calculate the HDI are a) the health of the population i.e life expectancu, b) GNI-Gross National Income i.e Standard of living and Education. The mentioned three factors will significantly contribute toward accomplishment of economic development thereby economic growth would be enhanced well. Thus, we can deduce that economic developmental goals should be regulated and optimized well in order to achieve economic growth. As the growth is being determined with developmental goals and the combination of production, creative innovations and latest upgradation, it is better to regulate and enact various legislations to make our country forward, foster and flourish with great economic development and National Institute of Transforming India Aayog (NITI Aayog) is such apex which serves the people with formulating the policies which is the think tank for Government of India and nodal agency tasked with catalyzing economic development and fostering the cooperative federalism through the involvement of State Governments of India in the economic policy making process using various bottom-up approaches. NITI Aayog is one such flagship program that itself considered as state of art resource being considered as a great example and thought to achieve the economic development. So, with the help of various programs and flagships, India and other underdeveloped nations can flourish and rise their country better with great infrastructure which will lead to economic development. Hence, Economic Development is key component to achieve a better, sustainable and esteem Economic Growth of the country respectively.





WORD OF THE YEAR

Every year Oxford selects a word to be added to the dictionary. This word usually depicts the current state of the world. This year, that honour goes to 'goblin mode'.

'Goblin mode' is defined as a sort of behaviour that doesn't fit the usual social norms. It depicts behaviour that is unapologetic, lazy, selfindulgent, or greedy.

The word 'Goblin mode' was first introduced on Twitter in 2009. It has been in use ever since then. For the first time ever, the Oxford English Dictionary's (OED) word of the year was left to the public to decide. Over 340,000 people participated, with 'goblin mode' receiving 93% of the total votes.

The Merriam-Webster Word of the Year for 2022 is "gaslighting." According to Merriam-Webster, the dictionary definition of gaslighting is, "The act or practice of grossly misleading someone, especially for one's own advantage," "psychological manipulation of a person usually over an extended period of time that causes the victim to question the validity of their own thoughts, perception of reality, or memories..." This year, the word experienced a 1,740% increase in lookups. Interest remained high throughout the entirety of the year, too. It's safe to assume this word won't be removed from the dictionary anytime soon!





Because the Merriam-Webster Word of the Year is driven by data, it's obvious that plenty of people were searching for this term in 2022. Traditionally, a singular event spurs people to search for a word that leads to its selection, such as "vaccine" in 2021. However, the same can't be said for "gaslighting."

It is possible that because "gaslighting" is vaguely connected to other buzzy terms such as "fake news" and is applicable to personal relationships, politics and beyond, people were curious about it in 2022. However, it's impossible to identify just one reason because Merriam-Webster doesn't track why visitors are searching the term—just that they are.






